Message from the President

It is my pleasure as the President of the Information Professionals Association (IPA) to present the 2024 Annual Report. As you can see from the information listed below, 2024 was an incredibly busy year for IPA and our members. A few of the highlights included forming multiple new communities of interest (COIs) across the U.S. At the start of the year, we had chapters in London and Tampa and have now added chapters in Washington, D.C., New York City, and Fayetteville, N.C. The COIs hosted a range of events over the year. The feedback from those who attended these meetings was exceptionally positive. For those who did not have the opportunity, we are planning a series of follow-ups and expect to further grow the number of COIs across the country. Next, thanks to a number of volunteers IPA redesigned its website and added an anthology. I encourage everyone to take a look and contribute. In October, IPA co-sponsored in Washington, D.C., a conference with another non-profit organization called Trust in Media (TIM). A shout out to the Washington, D.C., chapter for the incredible support and volunteer hours.

Over the course of the year, we said goodbye to long-serving board members Paul Leiber and Juliana Pilan; welcomed in two new members, Andrew Whiskeyman and Dave Acosta; and were fortunate to have Michael Williams return to the board. In September, the board met in person in the Washington, D.C,. area. During the meeting, the by-laws were updated, and the strategy for IPA's next steps was finalized. Among the significant changes to the by-laws were setting term limits for officers, adding requirements for each board member, and the reorganization of the board of advisors.

As we look forward to a great 2025, I am pleased to announce an IPA summit conference in the Washington, D.C., area from September 2-3, 2025. This will be the first ever of its kind, and I encourage all hands to attend. Over the next several months you will be receiving more on this event.

Goals and Accomplishments for 2024

The goals for IPA for 2024 included:

- Increase the number of communities of interest. We've formally added Washington DC and Tampa COIs, and are working with other locations where members have expressed interest in establishing a COI. London is likely to be our first overseas COI in 2025.
- Improve our outreach and marketing strategy to demonstrate value for our members. We hosted or co-hosted five events this year to increase engagement opportunities for our members:
 - o January 2024: Co-hosted a dinner with the PSYOP Regimental Association (PRA) and IPA members in Tampa
 - May 2024: Hosted a reception following the Operations in the Information Environment in conjunction with SOF Week in Tampa
 - July 2024: Co-hosted with CarahSoft and Meltwater at CarahSoft's Herndon VA facility
 - October 2024: Co-hosted with Trust in Media in Washington DC
 - o November 2024: Co-hosted a dinner with the PRA in Tampa
- Establish partnerships with related organizations. We've broadened our partnerships to include organizations with similar objectives as well as seeking additional sponsors to increase our engagement opportunities.

The Order of Hermes

The Order of Hermes (OoH) is IPA's honorary award which recognizes individuals for exceptional service and contributions in the field of cognitive security and information operations. The Order of Hermes can be awarded to individuals from the military, government, civilian or private sector positions (including academia, international or non-governmental organization). We have updated guidance and selection criteria for the award based on several years of lessons learned, which is available on the website. We have also created additional categories for the award to recognize different levels of contribution for the community, including noteworthy specific contributions (Silver Award) or for lifetime achievement (Gold Award) for those individuals who have made enduring and highly impactful contributions to the cognitive security or Information Operations (IO) disciplines. We have also recently added a Rising Stars award to recognize contributions from our next generation of professionals who make early but important contributions to the field.





Goals, Projects, and Scheduled Events for 2025

Goals

- Select a new board of advisors.
- o Establish additional regional COIs.
- o Increase active individual membership, including a 50% increase in student and under-30 demographic.
- Diversify our member demographics beyond our military and government base by actively recruiting academic, industry, media, and research professionals.
- o Increase volunteer opportunities for member participation through our established committees.
- o Increase corporate sponsorship and begin pursuing philanthropic support for our mission.
- o Grow weekly podcast downloads.
- Events We have three events scheduled for 2025 and we welcome the opportunity for partnering with other organizations and sponsors as we did in 2024 to provide additional engagement opportunities for our members, partners, and sponsors.
 - May 8: IPA Reception following the Operations in the Information Environment Symposium during SOF Week
 2025. The reception will be held from 4:15 6:15 PM in the Terrace Room at the JW Marriott hotel in Tampa (same location as last year). Additional details to follow on the IPA website and via email.
 - September 2-3: PINNACLE 2025 will be the first iteration of IPA's annual conference. The event will include keynote speakers, panels, working sessions, and a member meeting.  - Fall TBD: Connexions25: IPA will co-sponsor this event with the Connexions team, likely in October or November.
 - Local Community of Interest (COI) networking events: The IPA BoD works regularly with our COIs and sponsors to identify opportunities for local events that bring together information professionals to discuss a variety of topics. These events offer a more intimate setting than a larger conference, usually including 75-100 attendees gathering after business hours, often including a keynote speaker or panel discussion followed by networking with colleagues over drinks and hors d'oeuvres.
